## Public Open Day for R/V KAIREI and Mutsu Institute

The Mutsu Institute for Oceanography (MIO) of the Japan Agency for Marine-Earth Science and Technology (JAMSTEC; Yasuhiro Kato, President) will hold an open house of its facility and the Deep Sea Research Vessel "*KAIREI*" as described below. The open house also commemorates the 50th anniversary of Mutsu City and the 5th anniversary of its amalgamation with neighboring municipalities.
